Shelter Program

During a stay at a Housing for Homeless Shelter, clients will participate in programs and workshops developed to promote self-sufficiency and personal development. Housing for Homeless also works with clients to help them transition into a stable housing program. On-site case workers develop, in cooperation with clients, an extensive goal-oriented program. Case workers continually motivate clients to meet these goals. In turn, clients are given responsibilities around the shelter, including cleaning details and other applicable tasks.

Eligibility Requirements

Potential residents must fill out a shelter application and complete an interview process to be considered for placement.

- ◆ Must be homeless by HUD definitions
- ◆ Must be 18 or older
- ◆ Must be male and single (no children or significant other)

Intake Specialist will ask the applicant for the following documents:

- ◆ Social Security card
- ◆ Birth Certificate
- ◆ Driver's License/State ID
- ◆ Verification of income: paycheck stub/statement or SSI/SSDI award letter
- ◆ If referred by Agency (Agency name and Case Worker name & phone)



Shelter Program

Our objective is to transition residents back into our local community. Residents are to utilize all classes and groups offered such as:

- ◆ Substance Abuse Prevention
- ◆ Money Management
- ◆ Employment Specialist
- ◆ Financial Group

Case Management: Residents are provided case management and work together throughout their stay to prepare a short term and long term plan for stable housing.

Accommodations: For up to 4 single men

Laundry Room: In house washer and dryer. Residents will have assigned times to do their laundry.

Living Room & Kitchen: Residents will share a common area in the living room and kitchen area.

Meals: Residents are responsible for their own food. Refrigerator and store space will be assigned. Meals are to be cooked between the times of 7 am to 9 pm.

Self-Improvement: Residents will be required to attend classes, mentoring and workshops



Important Policies

- **Short-Term Stay:** Up to 30 days
- **Occupancy Fee:** \$10.00 per day
- **Shelter will be closed from:** 8:30 am - 6:00 pm Mon - Fri
- **Smoking:** Only allowed in designated outdoor areas.
- **Drug/Alcohol Free Environment**
- **Must comply with shelter policies, rules, and case plan**
- **If not employed, must be actively seeking employment or other source of income**
- **Must be actively seeking other housing**
- **Medications:** Residents are responsible for their own medications and for locking up their medications.
- **Security:** Residents may not unlock or prop open any door leading to the outside without approval from staff. Residents will not admit guests or unknown persons into the apartment without staff approval.
- **Weapons:** No weapons of any kind are permitted on the premises. Staff may call the police at their discretion if they have a reasonable and articulate suspicion that the resident or a visitor is engaged in criminal activity, has a weapon on premises or otherwise.
